

TRANSPORT LINKS

Find all the ways you can travel to and from Dublin Airport Central. We are Ireland's busiest bus terminus, with over 1,800 per day. Please find below a list of all bus operators and routes between Dublin Airport and Dublin City Centre and from Dublin City Centre. Dublin Airport is a 2 min walk away from Dublin Airport Central.

DUBLIN BUS

Dublin Bus offers many routes throughout Dublin, including the 16 to Ballinteer and the 41 to Lower Abbey Street. Dublin Bus operates from the Dublin Airport Bus Park in Zone 15.

AIRLINK EXPRESS

Airlink Express service will bring you directly to Dublin City Centre, Heuston and Connolly rail stations. The Airlink Express departs from just outside Terminal 1 Arrivals (Zone 2) and Terminal 2 Arrivals (Zone 20) and connects Dublin Airport with a number of popular Dublin locations. Use the pedestrian crossing separating the park from Terminal 2 and you will arrive at the bus stops. Using the Port Tunnel for speed, both the Airlink 747 and Airlink 757 connect Dublin Airport to the city centre. A Dublin Bus Airlink 747 and 757 services offer staff 50% off fares to Dublin City Centre. Show your driver your Dublin Airport Central card to avail of offer.

DUBLIN COACH

Dublin Coach provides a regular bus service linking Dublin Airport to the Red Cow Luas and Dundrum with 42 services each way, 7 days a week. Dublin Coach departs from the Dublin Airport Coach Park in Zone 16.

AIRCOACH

Aircoach offers services from Dublin Airport to Dublin City Centre and South County Dublin on a 24-hour basis. The Aircoach departs from Zone 11.

AIRPORT HOPPER

The Airport Hopper operates hourly shuttle buses from Dublin Airport to Maynooth and Tallaght, servicing Leixlip, Liffey Valley, Lucan, and Clondalkin. The Airport Hopper departs from the Dublin Airport coach park in Zone 16.

DUBLIN EXPRESS

Runs every 20 minutes from Terminal 2, 24 hours a day. DAC customers are entitled to get a third of the price off on presentation of DAC discount card. There are three services:

- » 783 - Customs House Quay - from the Airport 05 past the hour; return 00
- » 784 - Merrion Square (Holles Street) - from the Airport 25 past the hour; return 10 past
- » 782 - Smithfield (Arran Quay) - from the Airport 45 past the hour; return 30 past.

Dublin Express will depart from **Zone 1 and Zone 21.**

GO-AHEAD IRELAND

Go-Ahead Ireland offers the 102 route to Sutton Station which serves Swords, Malahide, Portmarnock and Sutton and the 33A that services Balbriggan, Skerries, Rush, Lusk and Swords Go-Ahead departs from the Dublin Airport Bus Park in Zone 15.

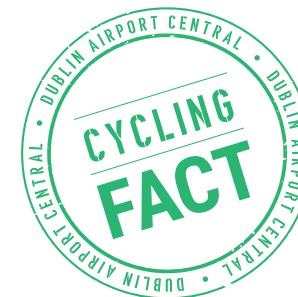

CYCLING & WALKING

Cycling and walking are the most healthy and environmentally friendly modes of commuting. Download the TFI Cycle Planner app for your phone to plan your cycle to work. It takes into account traffic flows and is customisable to avoid hills, awkward junctions and other variables. Covered bike parking is provided at the edge of the park, opposite the T2 multi-storey car park. This is access controlled and available only to staff at Dublin Airport Central. Showers with lockers are located on the ground floor of the building. The lockers are for short term usage and not for storing items during the day. Drying rooms are located beside the showers for wet gear. If you don't have a bike, check out the Cycle to Work tax incentive scheme at www.biketowork.ie

TAXIS

are available from the forecourts directly outside Terminal 1 & Terminal 2. Passengers should follow taxi signage to the designated ranks. A taxi dispatcher is available at either taxi rank if you require any further information or assistance.



An 8km cycle to work each day saves you the equivalent of **380l of petrol or diesel** that you would use commuting by car.
